Why sign up for PrestoPay?

- Presto Pay is fast and secure:
- Pay for all Scrip when you place your order – no checks needed
- Take advantage of ScripNow, Reload, and ReloadNow
- Uses the same Automated Clearing House (ACH) process as Payroll direct deposit, Social Security direct deposit, and Online bill payments
- Only \$0.15 per transaction
- One-way transaction: you pay for Scrip. There is no 'reverse' transaction. Issues are managed through the HTLC account
