THE FIRST STATION



Jesus is Condemned to Death.

P: We adore you, O Christ, and we praise you,

All: because by your suffering and death on the cross,
you have redeemed the world.

A READING FROM JOHN 19:13-16

When Pilate heard these words, he brought Jesus outside and sat on the judge's bench at a place called The Stone Pavement, or in Hebrew Gabbatha. Now it was the day of Preparation for the Passover; and it was about noon. He said to the Jews, "Here is your King!" They cried out, "Away with him! Away with him! Crucify him!" Pilate asked them, "Shall I crucify your King?" The chief priests answered, "We have no king but the emperor." Then he handed him over to them to be crucified.

MARY SPEAKS

PRAYER

P: Let us pray together:

All: When we are disheartened by the suffering around us and can see no way to help, Lord, have mercy. When we stand aside and fail to protest when others are victimized by slander, cruelty or injustice, Christ have mercy. When we refuse to act or to speak up because our cause is unpopular, Lord have mercy.

A READING FROM ISAIAH 53:7-8



MARY SPEAKS

PRAYER

P: Let us pray together:

All: Often, Lord, the cross seems to make no sense. And yet you have said, "Anyone who does not take up the cross and follow in my footsteps is not worthy of me." Help me, Lord, to bear the burden of my own pain. Help me, Lord, to relieve the burden of others' pain. Help me to do this, Lord, even when I do not understand.

A READING FROM PSALM 37:23-24



Our steps are made firm by the Lord, when he delights in our way; though we stumble, we shall not fall headlong, for the Lord holds us by the hand.

MARY SPEAKS

PRAYER

P: Let us pray together:
All: Lord, forgive us for the times we have refused to take risks for fear of falling on our faces and looking foolish before others. Forgive us for the times we have fallen and lacked the courage to begin anew. Forgive us for the times we have failed to encourage others who struggle with the weight of their own problems and uncertainties.

SONG . . . "O Lord, Hear My Prayer" - sing 2 times

THE FOURTH STATION



Jesus Meets His Mother.

P: We adore you, O Christ, and we praise you,

**All: because by your suffering and death on the cross,
you have redeemed the world.**

A READING FROM LUKE 2:34-35

Then Simeon blessed them and said to his mother Mary, "This child is destined for the falling and the rising of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be opposed so that the inner thoughts of many will be revealed - and a sword will pierce your own soul too."

MARY SPEAKS

P: Let us pray together:

All: Mary, we admire your courage. You were there for Jesus when many who loved him, who had shared those wonder-filled days of his ministry, ran away in fear and despair. You faced the challenge in Jesus' eyes. Often we are called to face things in life

P: Let us pray together:

All: Lord, whatever good we do on this earth, may we do it freely. Let us love and serve others, not because we are forced to do so by the pressure of public opinion, not out of any self-centered need, but because we freely choose to be a servant of our brothers and sisters.

A READING FROM ISAIAH 53:2-3



MARY SPEAKS

P: Let us pray together:

All: It is better to light one candle than to curse the darkness. Help us, Lord, to carry out those small acts of kindness that make life richer and fuller and brighter for us all. Help us to believe that we can make a difference with every prayer we say, and with every act of mercy we perform.

SONG . . . “Nothing Can Ever Come” - sing 2 times

MARY SPEAKS

P: Let us pray together:

All: When we fail, Lord, help us to forgive ourselves. When we fall, Lord, grant us the strength to rise and continue to do whatever needs to be done. And when we grow weary, Lord, remind us that every step on our journey has meaning.

SONG . . . “Holy Spirit, Come to Us” - repeat 2 times

A READING FROM LUKE 23:27-29

A great number of the people followed him, and among them were women who were beating their breasts and wailing for him. But Jesus turned to them and said, "Daughters of Jerusalem, do not weep for me, but weep for yourselves and for your children. For the days are surely coming when they will say, 'Blessed are the barren, and the wombs that never bore, and the breasts that never nursed.'"

MARY SPEAKS

P: Let us pray together:

All: Lord, save us from centering on ourselves and shutting out others from our concern. Though our problems are real and our needs are great, let us not overlook those who daily come into our lives, hungry for a little warmth, looking for a little attention.

SONG . . . “Nothing Can Trouble” - sing 2 times

MARY SPEAKS


P: Let us pray together:

Jesus is Stripped of His Garments.



P: We adore you, O Christ, and we praise you,

A READING FROM JOHN 19:23-24


When the soldiers had crucified Jesus, they took his clothes and divided them into four parts, one for each soldier. They also took his tunic; now the tunic was seamless, woven in one piece from the top. So they said to one another, "Let us not tear it, but cast lots for it to see who will get it."

MARY SPEAKS

P: Let us pray together:

All: Jesus, as we recall your suffering and death, we pray for all the persecutors in the world who lose their humanity in their passion to subjugate and control others. And we pray for all who have been victims of people's inhumanity to their fellow human beings.

SONG . . . "Bless the Lord" - sing 2 times



P: Lord Jesus crucified,

All: have mercy on us.



THE ELEVENTH STATION



Jesus Is Nailed to the Cross.

P: We adore you, O Christ, and we praise you,

All: because by your suffering and death on the cross, you have redeemed the world.

A READING FROM LUKE 23:32-33

Two others also, who were criminals, were led away to be put to death with him. When they came to the place that is called The Skull, they crucified Jesus there with the criminals, one on his right and one on his left.

MARY SPEAKS

P: Let us pray together:

All: Lord, often we have asked ourselves, who am I? Why am I here? What am I called to do? We look to your life and death for answers, and the answers are quite simple: we are loved, and we are called to love.

SONG . . . “*Jesus, Remember Me*” - sing 2 times

THE TWELFTH STATION



Jesus Dies on the Cross.

P: We adore you, O Christ, and we praise you,

All: because by your suffering and death on the cross, you have redeemed the world.

A READING FROM LUKE 23:44-47

It was now about noon, and darkness came over the whole land until three in the afternoon, while the sun's light failed; and the curtain of the temple was torn in two. Then Jesus, crying with a loud voice, said, "Father, into your hands I commend my spirit." Having said this, he breathed his last. When the centurion saw what had taken place, he praised God and said, "Certainly this man was innocent."

MARY SPEAKS

P: Let us pray together:

All: Jesus, you waited to be born. Jesus, you waited to die. Jesus, you waited to rise in triumph. Grant us patience to wait. Help us to endure our own weaknesses, to endure the darkness that sometimes envelops us, to endure the little crosses and the little deaths that daily confront us. Jesus, brother, like you may we always place ourselves in God's hands.

SONG . . . "In God Alone" - sing 2 times

Jesus Is Taken Down from the Cross.

P: We adore you, O Christ, and we praise you,

All: because by your suffering and death on the cross,
you have redeemed the world.

A READING FROM ISAIAH 53:8-9

By a perversion of justice he was taken away. Who could have imagined his future? For he was cut off from the land of the living, stricken for the transgression of my people. They made his grave with the wicked and his tomb with the rich, although he had done no violence, and there was no deceit in his mouth.

MARY SPEAKS

P: Let us pray together:

All: Lord, often endings are difficult to deal with. The ending of the life of a loved one, the ending of a project, a career, a relationship, disturbs and grieves us. In times such as these, Lord, help us to grow, even as we experience diminishment.

SONG . . . “Stay with Me” - sing 2 times

A READING FROM MATTHEW 27:59-60

So Joseph took the body and wrapped it in a clean linen cloth and laid it in his own new tomb, which he had hewn in the rock. He then rolled a great stone to the door of the tomb and went away.

MARY SPEAKS

P: Let us pray together:

All: Jesus, there are times in our lives when things fall apart, when dreams are shattered, when hope no longer seems possible. In our poverty, our brokenness, we come to you for healing. In those times of trial, Jesus, remind us of your love, remind us of your forgiveness, remind us of your promise to be with us always, and grant us the grace to go forward in faith.

SONG . . . “Wait for the Lord” - sing 2 times

Wait for the Lord, whose day is near.

Wait for the Lord: be strong, take heart!

P: Lord Jesus crucified,

All: have mercy on us.

DISMISSAL

P: Go to dark Gethsemane, and watch with Christ through this time of darkness and sorrow. Do not turn away from this time of grief, but in all things turn to God with prayer. See Jesus: beaten, bound, reviled, accused, condemned, and crucified. Do not shun suffering or sacrifice, but trust that God is with us in all of life's suffering.


