WELCOME

SINGING BOWL

CALL TO WORSHIP

L: Come! Rejoice in our God. Let us give thanks, whatever life brings.

All: May those who sow in tears reap with shouts of joy.

L: Let us prepare our hearts and our world for the Prince of Peace, who is coming.

All: May all who weep come home with shouts of joy.

L: Prepare the way of the Lord, and make straight the path for God's arrival.

All: In prayer, song, and service, let us prepare for the birth of love.

CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS

All may make the sign of the cross.

P: God of the prophets, we give thanks for the voices that cry out and demand our attention.

All: They call us to put our trust and hope in you.

P: Forgive us when we close our eyes to your vision,

All: and when we stop our ears to your promise.

P: Heal our weakness when we give up on ourselves,

All: on one another, and on you.

P: Free us from hopeless living,

All: that we may joyfully love and serve others in your holy name.

Silence for Reflection

P: Know that we are forgiven in Christ's name.

All: May Love live in us and through us, that all may know God's peace.

ADVENT CANDLE LIGHTING

P: We wait for You in the stillness. In the darkness before dawn.

All: We are sheep without a Shepherd, we are shepherds waiting for the news.

P: The prophet said, He tends his flock like a shepherd:

All: He gathers the lambs in his arms and carries them close to his heart; he gently leads those that have young.

P: And there were shepherds living out in the fields nearby, keeping watch over their flocks at night.

All: An angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified.

P: But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid. I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people.

All: We wait in joy.

Candles are lit.

P: Let us pray: Gracious God, in a world where the message is "be happy," we are reminded that only you grant the gift of true joy.

All: This morning let us hear again with joyful hearts and proclaim with elated voices the wondrous refrain of your

coming: "The Lord, our God, is with us both now and forevermore." We pray this in the name of Christ, our Savior. Amen.

GREETING

P: Strengthen your hearts, for the coming of the Lord is near! God is with you.

All: And also with you.

L: Stir up the wills of your faithful people, Lord God,

All: and open our ears to the words of your prophets, that, anointed by your Spirit, we may testify to your light; through Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

INTRODUCTION TO THE WORD

Reader: Listen for God's word coming to us in scripture.

All: Our hearts and minds are open.

FIRST READING . . . *Isaiah 61:1-4, 8-11*

The spirit of the Lord GOD is upon me,

because the LORD has anointed me;

he has sent me to bring good news to the oppressed, to bind up the brokenhearted,

to proclaim liberty to the captives, and release to the prisoners;

to proclaim the year of the LORD's favor, and the day of vengeance of our God; to comfort all who mourn;

to provide for those who mourn in Zion—

to give them a garland instead of ashes,
the oil of gladness instead of mourning,
the mantle of praise instead of a faint spirit.
They will be called oaks of righteousness,
the planting of the LORD, to display his glory.
They shall build up the ancient ruins,
they shall raise up the former devastations;
they shall repair the ruined cities,
the devastations of many generations.

For I the LORD love justice, I hate robbery and wrongdoing; I will faithfully give them their recompense, and I will make an everlasting covenant with them. Their descendants shall be known among the nations, and their offspring among the peoples; all who see them shall acknowledge that they are a people whom the LORD has blessed. I will greatly rejoice in the LORD, my whole being shall exult in my God; for he has clothed me with the garments of salvation, he has covered me with the robe of righteousness, as a bridegroom decks himself with a garland, and as a bride adorns herself with her jewels. For as the earth brings forth its shoots, and as a garden causes what is sown in it to spring up, so the Lord GOD will cause righteousness and praise to spring up before all the nations.

GOSPEL . . . *John 1:6-8, 19-28*

There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. He came as a witness to testify to the light, so that all might believe through him. He himself was not the light, but he came to testify to the light.

This is the testimony given by John when the Jews sent priests and Levites from Jerusalem to ask him, "Who are you?" He confessed and did not deny it, but confessed, "I am not the Messiah." And they asked him, "What then? Are you Elijah?" He said, "I am not." "Are you the prophet?" He answered, "No." Then they said to him, "Who are you? Let us have an answer for those who sent us. What do you say about yourself?" He said,

"I am the voice of one crying out in the wilderness,

'Make straight the way of the Lord,'" as the prophet Isaiah said.

Now they had been sent from the Pharisees. They asked him, "Why then are you baptizing if you are neither the Messiah, nor Elijah, nor the prophet?" John answered them, "I baptize with water. Among you stands one whom you do not know, the one who is coming after me; I am not worthy to untie the thong of his sandal." This took place in Bethany across the Jordan where John was baptizing.
