P: Let us pray: Gracious God, your Spirit has led us throughout the days and nights of our Advent journey. Thank you for opening our eyes to see more of your presence in our world and in our lives.

All: We rejoice in your ultimate gift of sending a Savior who has taught us the fullness of what hope, peace, joy, and love are all about. Joy to the world, the Lord is come! Amen.

All: we come, joining the shepherds who are stunned by wonder.

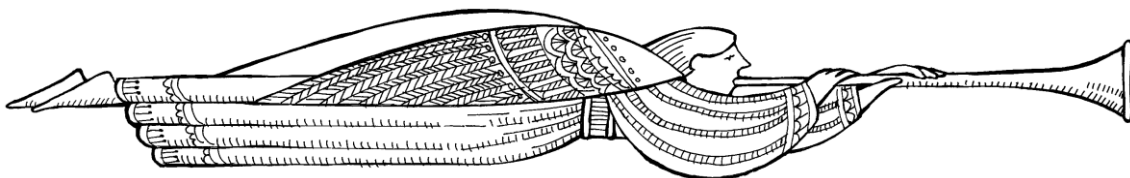
L: On this most silent night,

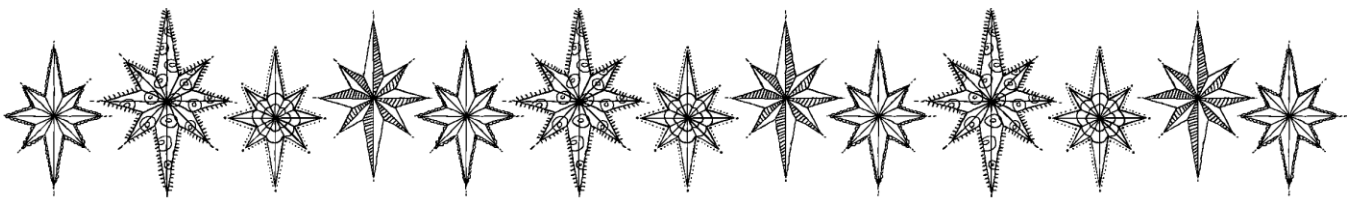

INTRODUCTION TO THE WORD

Reader: A child is born to us, a son given to all the world.

All: As we hear the familiar story this night, may we listen anew for signs of God's glory and grace.



READING . . . *Luke 2:1-20*

In those days a decree went out from Emperor Augustus that all the world should be registered. This was the first registration and was taken while Quirinius was governor of Syria. All went to their own towns to be registered. Joseph also went from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to the city of David called Bethlehem, because he was descended from the house and family of David. He went to be registered with Mary, to whom he was engaged and who was expecting a child. While they were there, the time came for her to deliver her child. And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in bands of cloth and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn. In that region there were shepherds living in the fields, keeping watch over their flock by night. Then an angel of the Lord stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid; for see – I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord. This will be a sign for you: you will find a child wrapped in bands of cloth and lying in a manger." And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host, praising God and saying, "Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace among those whom he favors!" When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let us go now to Bethlehem and see this thing that has taken place, which the Lord has made known to us." So they went with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the child lying in the manger. When they saw this, they made known what had been told them about this child; and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds told them. But Mary treasured all these words and pondered them in her heart. The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, as it had been told them.

L: As sages once brought gold, frankincense, and myrrh, we are invited to bring our gifts to the Christ child.

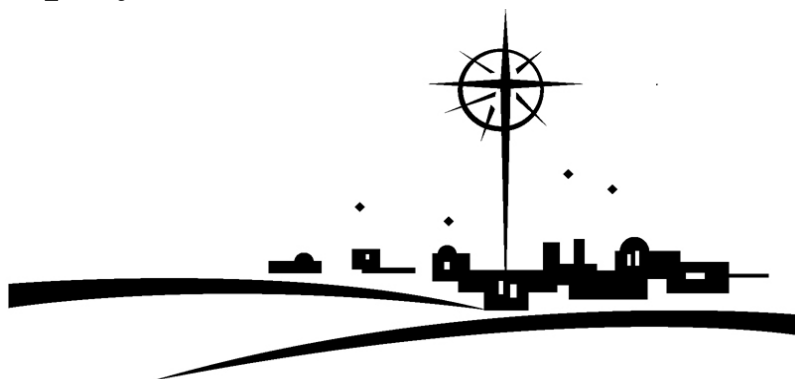
All: Our gifts need not be shiny or big, for any gift lovingly given becomes a gift of light and love for the world.

THE PRAYER OF THE CHURCH

L: Joining our voices with the song of the angels, let us pray for the church, the world, and all who are in need. The shepherds sing, “Jesus Christ is born!” Let your church throughout the world proclaim this good news, over the hills and everywhere. Unite the voices of all your faithful people in songs of praise and rejoicing. Hear us, O God.

All: Your mercy is great.

L: Heaven and nature sing, “Joy to the world!” Give respite to flocks, fields, and those who tend them. Come near to us in the beauty of nighttime, the shining of the stars, and the hush of a world at rest. May our wonder at your creation rouse our care for all the earth. Hear us, O God.

All: Your mercy is great.

L: Mary sings melodies of comfort to her newborn child. Bring rest and reassurance to those facing struggles this night. Shelter travelers and those without homes. Console those who lie awake due to pain or anxiety. Heal those who are sick or hurting. Hear us, O God.

All: Your mercy is great.

L: The heavenly chorus sings, “Glory to God in the highest!” We give you thanks for all the saints who have proclaimed your glory in word and deed. Let us join them this night in joyful praise around your eternal throne. Hear us, O God.

All: Your mercy is great.

L: Hear now the prayers of our hearts said silently or aloud.

Here other prayers may be offered.

L: Hear us, O God.

All: Your mercy is great.

L: God of mercy, come quickly to us with grace upon grace as we lift these and all our prayers to you, in the name of Jesus.

All: Amen.

EUCCHARISTIC PRAYER

P: Holy God, our Source and Ending, Alpha and Omega, we give thanks to you! You have called all creation into being, setting the earth on its foundations. You have spread out the heavens like a tent, and set a boundary to the seas, you have filled the world with your creatures and called all things good. The heavenly beings are your messengers night and day, and with them we sing and give glory to you:

All: Holy, holy, holy, Lord God of power and might. Heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest! Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest!

P: In these latter days, God leaned toward the earth and spoke to us by a Son, Jesus the Beloved. Born of our sister Mary and the Holy Spirit, guarded by our brother Joseph, Jesus came among us as a baby, humbly born, cradled beside the beasts and warmed by their breath, human as we are, in need of human love.

All: Yet kings bowed down before him, bringing gifts and emperors were troubled by his reign—this Child in whom all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell.

P: This Word of God made flesh and full of grace was sent to deliver us from our sin, from the power of evil and the fear of death. As a servant, Jesus emptied himself of might upon the cross, and as the risen Anointed One is enthroned at God's right hand to bring mercy and justice to all the earth at the end of days. And so, rejoicing in all God has done for us, we proclaim the mystery of our faith:

All: Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again!

P: Holy God, as you visited us in the birth of Jesus, visit us now by the power of your Spirit in these elements of bread and wine, making them for us the Body and Blood of Christ, the banquet

of heaven here on earth, as we remember how Jesus took bread and blessed and broke it and gave it to his friends, saying, “Take, eat, this is my body, given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me.” and after supper, took a cup of wine and blessed and gave it to them, saying: “Drink this, all of you. This cup is the new covenant in my blood, poured out for you and for many for the forgiveness of sin. Do this for the remembrance of me.” Blessed God, shed your grace brighter than starlight on us that we may bear your good tidings to all and renew the weary world in your name: the name of Emmanuel—God-With-Us,

All: to whom we give honor and glory in joy, now and forever. Amen.

THE LORD’S PRAYER

P: Gathered into one by the Holy Spirit, let us pray as Jesus taught us:

All: Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as in heaven. Give us today our daily bread. Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us. Save us from the time of trial and deliver us from evil. For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours, now and forever. Amen.

FRACTION RITE

P: Joy to the world! Our Savior has come.

All: Let every heart receive our Redeemer!

P: Body of Christ, given for you. Blood of Christ, shed for you. Let us now share this meal together.

COMMUNION

You are invited to participate in communion with your own bread and wine or grape juice.

POST-COMMUNION BLESSING

P: We continue with the Post-Communion Blessing:

On this night, O God, you gave us Christ the Son to save us.

All: As you sent the one foretold, send us now with good news for all people.

P: Let the gladness of this meal have no end

All: as we share with others the joy that fills us; through Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord. Amen.

CANDLE LIGHTING LITANY

P: The God who said, “Let there be light,” has caused light to shine in our hearts.

All: That light is the glory of God reflected in the face of Jesus Christ.

L: As our candles are a sea of light lit from the one light of Christ, so may we the people of God reflect Christ’s light and love in this world.

All: Amen. May it be so.

You are invited to light candles while singing “*Silent Night*”
