#### SINGING BOWL

With the help of the Spirit, look within. See what burdens may be lifted, what obstacles may be removed, what new life and promise await us.

### **CALL TO WORSHIP**

- L: Eternal God, we give thanks for the witness of bold women. In early times, today and into the future, bold women show us how to live as God's beloved children in God's beloved creation.
- All: We live into our baptismal call to work for justice and peace for all God's creatures. Together, we say: Thank you, God!

### **CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS**

All may make the sign of the cross, the sign marked at baptism.

P: Wellspring of salvation, when we are parched from thirst and turn to the dry wells of worldly promise,

All: restore us with the healing waters of your grace;

P: when the course ahead is littered with wreckage and refuse from our past, wash away our sins and our sorrows,

All: and carry us forward on the river of your mercy and your love.

P: Shower us with your living water, and refresh our souls,

All: that we may be washed clean in the river of your forgiveness and your grace.

Time of silent reflection . . .

P: Our hope and assurance rest in God's unfailing love and forgiveness.

All: In this love and forgiveness, we encounter the living God.

P: Blessed be the holy Trinity, one God, the fountain of living water, the rock who gave us birth, our light and our salvation.

All: Amen.

#### LITANY OF BOLDNESS

L: Lord our God, we give thanks for the witness of bold women. In early times, today and into the future, bold women show us how to live as God's beloved children in God's beloved creation. We live into our baptismal call to work for justice and peace for all God's creatures. Together, we say:

## All: Thank you, God!

L: O God of our ancestors, we remember the bold witness of our foremothers who paved the way for all women, lay and ordained.

All: We give you thanks, O God.

L: O Holy One, who breathes life into us all, we raise before you the bold women among us today.

# All: We give you thanks, O God.

L: For those who pray, for those who parent, for those who study, for those who advocate,

# All: We give you thanks, O God.

L: For those who laugh, for those who share, for those who extend hospitality, for those who smile,

## All: We give you thanks, O God.

L: O Gracious One, forgive us when we are too timid to live up to the boldness you have placed within us.

## All: We pray to you, O God.

L: O Gracious One, enable us to recognize, honor and support the boldness you have placed within others.

## All: We pray to you, O God.

L: O God of infinite possibility, grant to us all the opportunity to act boldly on our faith in Jesus Christ.

## All: Hear our prayer.

L: O God of abundant life, grant to us all emotional, physical and spiritual wholeness so that we might best serve others in your name.

## All: Hear our prayer.

L: O God of strength, give us courage, hope and open hearts, that we might experience expanding possibilities and grow through change.

## All: Hear our prayer.

L: Each of us has been surrounded by bold women on our way, if only we look for them. For whom do you thank God today?

Name her aloud and let us thank God for her witness.

Here persons may speak the names of bold women out loud.

# L: Together, we say:

### All: Thank you, God!

L: Thank you, God, for the witness of all bold women yesterday, today, and tomorrow. We praise you for their witness to your love and mercy.

All: Strengthen us to live out our baptismal call to serve you and our neighbor with all our heart, with all our mind, with all our strength. Thank you, God! Alleluia, Amen.

#### PRAYER OF THE DAY

L: God of tender care, like a mother, you never forget your children, and you know already what we need.

All: In all our anxiety give us trusting and faithful hearts, that in confidence and boldness we may embody the peace and justice of your Son, Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord. Amen.

#### INTRODUCTION TO THE WORD

Reader: We continue with the Introduction to the Word:

Lead us in your truths, O God.

All: Teach us your ways and your paths.

Reader: Into whatever journey lies before us,

All: lead on, Holy Spirit; lead on.

### **READING** . . . *Genesis* 17:1-7, 15-16

When Abram was ninety-nine years old, the LORD appeared to Abram, and said to him, "I am God Almighty; walk before me, and be blameless. And I will make my covenant between me and you, and will make you exceedingly numerous." Then Abram fell on his face; and God said to him, "As for me, this is my covenant with you: You shall be the ancestor of a multitude of nations. No longer shall your name be Abram, but your name shall be Abraham; for I have made you the ancestor of a multitude of nations. I will make you exceedingly fruitful; and I will make nations of you, and kings shall come from you. I will establish my covenant between me and you, and your offspring after you throughout their generations, for an

everlasting covenant, to be God to you and to your offspring after you."

God said to Abraham, "As for Sarai your wife, you shall not call her Sarai, but Sarah shall be her name. I will bless her, and moreover I will give you a son by her. I will bless her, and she shall give rise to nations; kings of peoples shall come from her."

# **GOSPEL** . . . *Mark* 8:31-38

[Jesus] began to teach them that the Son of Man must undergo great suffering, and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests, and the scribes, and be killed, and after three days rise again. He said all this quite openly. And Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him. But turning and looking at his disciples, he rebuked Peter and said, "Get behind me, Satan! For you are setting your mind not on divine things but on human things."

He called the crowd with his disciples, and said to them, "If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me. For those who want to save their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake, and for the sake of the gospel, will save it. For what will it profit them to gain the whole world and forfeit their life? Indeed, what can they give in return for their life? Those who are ashamed of me and of my words in this adulterous and sinful generation, of them the Son of Man will also be ashamed when he comes in the glory of his Father with the holy angels."
