All: By Jesus, the worker of miracles, there is always more than enough.

P: Through Jesus, the bread of life, you are shown God's mercy: you are forgiven and loved into abundant life.

All: Amen.

L: You call us to a generous form of friendship, O God.

All: When we listen carefully and encourage with sensitivity, your presence is felt.

L: You call us to a generous spirit as we work, O God.

All: When we help out carefully, and share our rewards sacrificially, your Word is heeded.

L: You call us to look at the generosity of Jesus, O God.

All: And as we look up at the cross, we know how far generosity can go. Amen.
