Now if Christ is proclaimed as raised from the dead, how can some of you say there is no resurrection of the dead? If there is no resurrection of the dead, then Christ has not been raised; and if Christ has not been raised, then our proclamation has been in vain and your faith has been in vain. We are even found to be misrepresenting God, because we testified of God that he raised Christ—whom he did not raise if it is true that the dead are not raised. For if the dead are not raised, then Christ has not been raised. If Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile and you are still in your sins. Then those also who have died in Christ have perished. If for this life only we

have hoped in Christ, we are of all people most to be pitied.

But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have died.



THE EUCHARIST

L: God of wisdom, with gratitude and love

All: we remember your mighty acts.

L: You created a world that was good.

All: You gave us this earth to enjoy.

L: You trusted us to share with you in caring for it.

All: And when we sinned, you still did not abandon us but made covenant with our ancestors.

P: Shame has chained us, holding us back from inclusive tables.

All: Shame has driven us from sanctuaries and gatherings.

P: No longer. Guilt will not prevent us from seeing God's grace.

All: In this space, all are welcome.

P: At this table, no lips are too unclean, no hearts are too tarnished, no past too corrupt to receive the gift of God's grace. Through this table of bread and cup, we look toward the future with hope. We are reminded that our past lies behind us, that the grace of God has overcome

our fears and our indiscretions. Through Christ's great love, we are no longer afraid of the future. Through Christ's gracious meal, we are provided a second chance.

In the night in which he was betrayed, our Lord Jesus took bread, and gave thanks; broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying: "Take and eat; this is my body, given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me." Again, after supper, he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink, saying: "This cup is the new covenant in my blood, shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin. Do this for the remembrance of me." Let us proclaim the mystery of faith:

- All: Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.
- P: We recall the words and blessings of Jesus each time we unite at his table.
- All: We remember the gifts of Jesus the Christ each time we wake to a new day and step into his renewed future.
- P: May the Spirit of God bless the great table of Christ. May the Spirit of God help us recognize God's grace in the breaking of the bread and in the pouring of the cup.
- All: May the Spirit of God encourage us to embrace our divine callings, as we all work to create God's realm here on earth.

THE LORD'S PRAYER

- P: Gathered into one by the Holy Spirit, let us pray as Jesus taught us, using the language or translation which is most familiar to each of us.
- All: Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as in heaven. Give us today our daily bread.
