
P: Have mercy on us!

who led chariots and warriors to their doom.


a mighty army fallen, never to rise again, snuffed out and extinguished like a wick: "Forget the events of the past, ignore the things of long ago!

GOSPEL . . . John 12:1-11 (The Inclusive Bible)

"Six days before Passover, Jesus went to Bethany, the village of Lazarus, whom Jesus had raised from the dead. There they gave a banquet in Jesus' honor, at which Martha served. Lazarus was one of those at the table. Mary brought a pound of costly ointment, pure nard, and anointed the feet of Jesus, wiping them with her hair. the house was full of the scent of the ointment.

Judas Iscariot, one of the disciples—the one who was to betray Jesus—protested, "Why wasn't this ointment sold? It could have brought nearly a year's wages, and the money been given to poor people!" Judas didn't say this because he was concerned for poor people, but because he was a thief. He was in charge of the common fund and would help himself to it.

So Jesus replied, "Leave her alone. She did this in preparation for my burial. You have poor people with you always. But you won't always have me."

Meanwhile a large crowd heard that Jesus was there and came to see not only Jesus, but also Lazarus, whom he raised from the dead. So the chief priests planned to kill Lazarus as well, since it was because of him that many of the people were leaving them and believing in Jesus.

P: The Gospel of our Living God.



All: We do so as an act of faith, and in support of God's work in this congregation and the world.



L: The God of the everlasting covenants is with you!

P: Your ways were not the ways of chaos, God of Wonder and Delight, and so with thoughts beyond understanding you spoke, and waters rushed through the weary lands; you listened, and songbirds composed anthems for you. You crafted humanity in your image, your steadfast love a promise to us for all time, but we did not listen

carefully to all you spoke, and so spent your blessings on those temptations which never could keep us satisfied. WORDS OF INSTITUTION

P: In the night in which he was betrayed, Jesus took bread, and gave thanks; broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying: "Take and eat; this is my body, given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me." Again, after supper, he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink, saying: "This cup is the new covenant in my blood, shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin. Do this for the remembrance of me." With this bread and cup we remember our Savior's Passover from death to life.

As we draw closer to that week we call Holy, as we remember the One we call Savior, we speak of that mystery we call faith:

All: Christ died, witnessing to the world; Christ rose, destroying the destroyer; Christ will come, blessing us forever.

- P: From the generosity of your heart you provide the gifts of the bread and the cup, charging us nothing, as your Spirit pours out love and grace on all who gather at the feast of remembrance.
- All: Here, we are fed with that which is not bread, but the very life we need, so we can go forth to serve your people.
- P: Here, our thirsty souls are refreshed by the taste of peace and hope, so we might speak out for all who are ignored by the world.

THE LORD'S PRAYER

- P: Gathered into one by the Holy Spirit, let us pray as Jesus taught us, using the language or translation which is most familiar to each of us.
- All: Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as in heaven. Give us today our daily bread. Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us. Save us from the time of trial and deliver us from evil. For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours, now and forever. Amen.

All: All are invited to this Table.








Holy Communion is open to all.
