L: It is in this place of discovery that we can come searching.


All: We come to this place, to find the One who has been looking for us.



# The Story that Shapes and Forms Us

## INTRODUCTION TO THE WORD

Reader: Wait! Do you notice something about this moment?

All: The Spirit is near, as near as our next breath.

Reader: Breathe! Do you notice something about this breath?

All: The Spirit is here, in our very breath—

Reader: ready to speak, ready to move, **All:** ready to transform our lives.

Reader: Today's reading is from Colossians, chapter three,

beginning with the first verse.

#### **READING** – Colossians 3:1-11

So if you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth, for you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. When Christ who is your life is revealed, then you also will be revealed with him in glory.

Put to death, therefore, whatever in you is earthly: fornication, impurity, passion, evil desire, and greed (which is idolatry). On account of these the wrath of God is coming on those who are disobedient. These are the ways you also once followed, when you were living that life. But now you must get rid of all such things—anger, wrath, malice, slander, and abusive language from your mouth. Do not lie to one another, seeing that you have stripped off the old self with its practices and have clothed yourselves with the new self, which is being renewed in knowledge according to the image of its creator. In that renewal there is no longer Greek and Jew, circumcised and uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, slave and free; but Christ is all and in all!

Reader: Word of God, word of life.

All: Thanks be to God.

#### **GOSPEL** – *Luke 12:13-21*

Someone in the crowd said to [Jesus,] "Teacher, tell my brother to divide the family inheritance with me." But he said to him, "Friend, who set me to be a judge or arbitrator over you?" And he said to them, "Take care! Be on your guard against all kinds of greed; for one's life does not consist in the abundance of possessions." Then he told them a parable: "The land of a rich man produced abundantly. And he thought to himself, 'What should I do, for I have no place to store my crops?' Then he said, 'I will do this: I will pull down my barns and build larger ones, and there I will store all my grain and

my goods. And I will say to my soul, Soul, you have ample goods laid up for many years; relax, eat, drink, be merry.' But God said to him, 'You fool! This very night your life is being demanded of you. And the things you have prepared, whose will they be?' So it is with those who store up treasures for themselves but are not rich toward God."


All: You make the rain to fall in its season, and the sun to shine, giving light and warmth to all your creatures.

As children of your covenant of love, sealed by water and the Spirit, we come to you now with joy and gratitude, remembering how Jesus shared bread and wine. renewing and reviving and rescuing the lives of his friends, his most faithful disciples, even as they faced their deepest fears and their greatest sins. On that night before his death, Jesus took bread, gave thanks to you, broke the bread, gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me." When the supper was over, Jesus took the cup, gave thanks to you, gave it to his disciples, and said, "Drink from this, all of you; this is my life in the new covenant, poured out for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as

you drink it, in remembrance of me." And so, in remembrance of these your life-giving acts of love and grace, we offer ourselves in praise and thanksgiving, as children of your covenant, renewed and redeemed by your grace, in union with Christ's love for us, as we proclaim the mystery of faith.

- All: Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.
- P: Pour out your Holy Spirit on us gathered here, and on these gifts of bread and wine.
- All: Make them be for us the body and blood of Christ, that we may become one with Christ, one with each other, and one in communion with you and with all the world.


#### THE LORD'S PRAYER

#### For communion at the altar rail:

You may come up the center aisle to the altar rail as space allows, stand or kneel, and hold out your hand for the pastor to drop the wafer into. Then take a cup of grape juice (white) or wine (red) from the assistant, partake, then return to your seat via the side aisles, depositing your disposable cup in the provided bowls.

# For communion at your seat with pre-packaged kit:

You may come to altar rail as above, take a communion kit from the assistant, and return to your seat to partake. Or you may remain seated and partake of the communion kit you picked up at the entrance. The ushers will come around to collect empty kits.
