



beginning with the fourth verse.

READING – Jeremiah 2:4-13

Hear the word of Yahweh, House of Jacob, all you tribes of the house of Israel!

Thus says Yahweh:

What fault did your ancestors find in me,

to make them wander so far astray?

They pursued hollow idols

and became hollow themselves.

They did not ask, 'Where is Yahweh,

who brought us up out from Egypt

and led us through the desert,

a barren and desolate country,

a land of drought and darkness,

a land no one passes through,

a land where no one dwells?'

I brought you into a land of plenty

to eat its fruits and other good things.

But once you entered my land you defiled it

and made my heritage an abomination.

The priests never asked themselves, 'Where is Yahweh?'

The administrators of the law ignored me.

The shepherds of the people rebelled against me.

The prophets prophesied in the name of Ba'al and pursued the Worthless One.

So once more I accuse you, says Yahweh— I accuse you and your children's children! Cross over to the coasts of Cyprus and look closely, send envoys to Kedar and examine carefully. see if there has ever been anything like this: Has a people ever changed its gods, even though they aren't gods at all? But my people exchanged their Glory for Worthlessness. Be appalled, O heavens, at this, be shocked and stupefied! says Yahweh. For my people committed two sins: they abandoned me, the fountain of living water; and they dug deep cisterns for themselves,

broken cisterns that hold no water.

GOSPEL – *Luke 14:1, 7-14*

One Sabbath, when Jesus came to eat a meal in the house of one of the leading Pharisees, the guests watched him closely.

Jesus went on to address a parable to the guests, noticing how they were trying to get a place of honor at the table.

"When you're invited to a wedding party, don't sit in the place of honor, in case someone more distinguished has been invited. Otherwise the hosts might come and say to you, 'Make room for this person,' and you would have to proceed shamefacedly to the lowest place. What you should do is go and sit in the lowest place, so that when your hosts approach you they'll say, 'My friend, come up higher.' This will win you the esteem of the other guests. For all who exalt themselves will be humbled, and those who humble themselves will be exalted."

Then Jesus said to the host, "Whenever you give a lunch or dinner, don't invite your friends or colleagues or relatives or wealthy neighbors. They might invite you in return and thus repay you. No, when you have a reception, invite those who are poor or have physical infirmities or are blind. You should be pleased that they can't repay you, for you'll be repaid at the resurrection of the just."



All: from dust and spirit you have woven our humanity;


P: in all our wanderings you never cease to call us to fullness of life.


All: You gave us Jesus, son of Mary, the bread of life broken for the world;

Calling them to his table, he took bread, gave thanks, broke it and said: 'This is my body, which is given for you. Do this to remember me.' In the same way after supper, he took the cup, saying: 'This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, whenever you drink it, to remember me.' As on that night, so here and now he offers himself in touch and taste beyond all words can hold. Great is the mystery of faith.

All: Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

P: Therefore, in our eating and drinking we are filled with the life-giving presence of Christ;

All: we proclaim him as creation's host, transforming poverty into plenty in the reckless generosity of love.

P: Inspire us with the hope that one day death and greed will be no more and people without number will come from east and west, north and south to share the kingdom meal.

All: We ask this through Jesus Christ our Lord, by whom and with whom and in whom in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory be yours, Mother of blessings, for ever and ever. Amen.

FRACTION RITE


P: Here is food that satisfies, the taste of communion. Here is wine pouring free, the washing away of fear. Here is life abundant, a table of peace for all.

For communion at the altar rail:

You may come up the center aisle to the altar rail as space allows, stand or kneel, and hold out your hand for the pastor to drop the wafer into. Then take a cup of grape juice (white) or wine (red) from the assistant, partake, then return to your seat via the side aisles, depositing your disposable cup in the provided bowls.

For communion at your seat with pre-packaged kit:

You may come to altar rail as above, take a communion kit from the assistant, and return to your seat to partake. Or you may remain seated and partake of the communion kit you picked up at the entrance. The ushers will come around to collect empty kits.


