WELCOME

SHARING OF THE PEACE

P: As we exchange signs of peace and love with one another, let us first look for the stranger who might one day be our friend.

All: Let us offer signs of peace and love beyond the familiar friends we so often greet.

P: The peace of Christ is with you.

All: And also with you.

CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS

All may make the sign of the cross, the sign marked at baptism.

P: On this Labor Day Sunday let us lift up all people who labor, either for pay or as volunteers,

All: in jobs or at school,

P: at home or in the workplace,

All: here at home and all around the world.

P: We are workers, God, just like you.

All: But we confess that our actions do not always affirm and honor each other.

P: Our work is not always done in a spirit that is pleasing to you.

All: We confess that, on some occasions, we have blindly bought goods made by people who are paid too little or work in unsafe conditions.

P: We admit that we have failed to end an unjust system in which some workers have jobs that provide good wages and benefits

All: while others may have no job, or one that pays little and provides few benefits.

P: Creator God, help us to be your people, working for a world where all workers are valued.

All: A world where those who clean houses are also able to buy houses to live in.

P: A world where those who grow food can also afford to eat their fill.

All: And one where those who serve and care for others – in stores, schools, hotels, restaurants, nursing homes, and many other places – are, themselves, also served and cared for.

P: A world where all workers everywhere share in the abundance that you have given us.

Silence is kept for reflection.

P: Our God is a God of grace and transformation.

All: When we ask, God gives us the courage and strength to live out our faith in the workplace and the marketplace, as well as in the sanctuary.

CALL TO WORSHIP

L: We are called to be people of faith in the midst of the world,

All: and so we mix our worship and our work, our faith and our life.

L: We gather here as people who live in the world and yet,

All: we gather as people who have been called to see the world from a different viewpoint.

L: God has called us together, God has called us to be part of a community.

All: God challenges us to consider questions of priority as we engage with the world.

L: In this time together,


All: may God open our hearts, minds and eyes,

L: For volunteers and mentors, for leaders and followers,

All: We give God thanks.

L: For those who are unemployed,

All: We ask for jobs.

L: For those who are underemployed,

All: We ask for work that satisfies.

L: For those who work in oppressive systems,

All: We ask relief.

L: For those whose work is demeaning,

All: We ask for respect.

L: Where you need us, O God, to make work available, joyful, respectful, fair, or reasonable,

All: Direct us in your ways.

L: When it is time, O God, to rest as you did after creation, in safety and honor,

All: Direct us in your ways.

L: For this opportunity to hold up our work in your presence, Holy God,

All: We give you thanks and praise.

INTRODUCTION TO THE WORD

Reader: Listen for the word of God. Strive to understand

Christ's teachings.

All: For this indeed is our treasure. May it light our

paths and make us ready to take action.

Reader: Today's reading is from Deuteronomy, chapter

thirty, beginning with the fifteenth verse.

READING – Deuteronomy 30:15-20

Today I have set before you life and success, or death and disaster. For today I command you to "love Yahweh, your God, to follow God's ways and keep the commandments, the laws and the customs. If you do, you will live and increase, and Yahweh, your God, will bless you in the land that you are entering to possess. But if your hearts stray and you do not listen to me, if you let yourself be drawn into the worship of other gods, and serve them, I tell you today, you will not survive. You will not live long in the land which you are now crossing the Jordan to enter and occupy.

I call heaven and earth to witness against you today: I set before you life or death, blessing or curse. Choose life, then, so that you and your descendants may live, by loving Yahweh, your God, by obeying God's voice and by clinging to Yahweh. For that will mean life for you, a long life in the land which God swore to give to your descendants Sarah and Abraham, Rebecca and Isaac, and Leah and Rachel and Jacob."

P: The Holy Gospel according to Luke, the fourteenth chapter.

All: Glory to you, O God.

GOSPEL – Luke 14:25-33

Large crowds followed Jesus. He turned to them and said, "If any of you come to me without turning your back on your mother and your father, your loved ones, your sisters and brothers, indeed your very self, you can't be my follower. Anyone who doesn't take up the cross and follow me can't be my disciple.

"If one of you were going to build a tower, wouldn't you first sit down and calculate the outlay to see if you have enough money to complete the project? You'd do that for fear of laying the foundation and then not being able to complete the work—because anyone who saw it would jeer at you and say, 'You started a building and couldn't finish it.' Or if the leaders of one country were going to declare war on another country, wouldn't they first sit down and consider whether, with an army of ten thousand, they could win against an enemy coming against them with twenty thousand? If they couldn't, they'd send a delegation while the enemy is still at a distance, asking for terms of peace.

"So count the cost. You can't be my disciple if you don't say goodbye to all of your possessions."

P: The Gospel, the good news of God.



All: Amen.

L: God is with you.

All: It is right to give our thanks and praise.


P: With boundless joy, we give thanks to you, O God of our Creation. From that first spark of life and Spirit: you set the cosmos in motion, you breathed life into humanity, you brought light into the world.

All: Your love amazes us, for even when our love turns to doubt or fear, your love is constant and sure.

P: You delivered our ancestors in faith from captivity, and you deliver us daily from the bonds that prevent us from living as people created in your image.

All: You freed your people and made a covenant to be present always.

P: You have spoken to us through prophets and you speak truth to us through one another. And so, with your people on earth and all the company of heaven, we praise your name and join their unending hymn, singing:



P: Nurturing God, your greatest gift to us is the grace we know through Jesus Christ.

All: Your Spirit descended on him and was manifest in his ministry.

P: Through his teachings and example, you showed us how to be with the poor, how to release those heavy laden from burdens, how to free the souls of the weary and anxious, and how to proclaim the good news of grace and peace and abundant love.

All: In an act of unimaginable love, you delivered us from hopelessness, and made a new covenant with us through water and the Spirit.

P: When Jesus died and rose again into eternity, he promised to abide with us in your Word and Holy Spirit. On the night in which he surrendered himself, Jesus took bread, gave thanks to you, broke the bread, gave it to the disciples, saying: "Take, eat; this is my body

which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me." When the meal had ended, Jesus took the cup, offered thanks, and gave it to the disciples, saying: "Drink from this, all of you; this cup of renewed covenant, which is poured out for you and for all for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink, in remembrance of me." And so, in remembrance of your mighty acts in Jesus Christ, we offer ourselves in praise and thanksgiving as we proclaim the mystery of faith.

All: Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

P: Pour out your Holy Spirit on us and on these gifts of bread and wine. Make them be for us the body of Christ, that we may be the body of Christ for all the world.

All: To You, O Creator of love and life, through Christ Jesus who makes all life new, in communion with your Holy Spirit who breathes new life into all, we honor and praise you for your everlasting love.

THE LORD'S PRAYER

P: Gathered into one by the Holy Spirit, let us pray as Jesus taught us, using the language or translation of our hearts.



Holy Communion is open to all. If you need communion brought to you, please let an usher know.

For communion at the altar rail:

You may come up the center aisle to the altar rail as space allows, stand or kneel, and hold out your hand for the pastor to drop the wafer into. Then take a cup of grape juice (white) or wine (red) from the assistant, partake, then return to your seat via the side aisles, depositing your disposable cup in the provided bowls.

For communion at your seat with pre-packaged kit:

You may come to altar rail as above, take a communion kit from the assistant, and return to your seat to partake. Or you may remain seated and partake of the communion kit you picked up at the entrance. The ushers will come around to collect empty kits.




