All: This is the fullness of time, when we live our new life in Christ.


L: This is the fullness of time, the gathering of God's worshiping children.

The Story that Shapes and Forms Us

Reader: The first reading is from the book of Numbers, chapter six, beginning with the twenty-second verse.

FIRST READING: *Numbers* 6:22-27

Yahweh God said to Moses, "Tell Aaron and his heirs:

This is how you will bless the Israelites. Say to them,

'May Yahweh bless you and keep you!

May Yahweh's face shine upon you, and be gracious to you!

May Yahweh look kindly upon you, and give you peace!'

"Thus will they invoke my Name over the Israelites, and then I myself will bless them!"

Reader: Here ends the reading.

The second reading is from the book of Galatians, chapter four, beginning with the fourth verse.

SECOND READING: Galatians 4:4-7

When the designated time had come, God sent forth the Christ—born of a woman, born under the Law—to deliver from the Law those who were subjected to it, so that we might receive our status as adopted heirs. The proof that you are children of God is the fact that God has sent forth into our hearts the Spirit of the Child who calls out "Abba!" You are

no longer slaves, but daughters and sons! And if you are daughters and sons, you are also heirs, by God's design.

THE GREAT THANKSGIVING

P: It is indeed right and salutary that we should at all times and in all places offer thanks and praise to You, gracious Lord. You comforted your people with the promise of the Redeemer, that our eyes of faith may be always open in expectation of the vision of your glory; that once beholding God made visible, we may be drawn

to love You, O God, whom we cannot see. And so, with the Church on earth and the hosts of heaven, we praise your name without ceasing . . .

THE SANCTUS: tune – "From Heaven Above"

All: As light breaks forth, we sing Your praise To you, Redeemer of our days, For we have found in Jesus' birth Good news of peace and human worth.

CONSECRATION

P: In these latter days, God leaned toward the earth and spoke to us by a Son, Jesus the Beloved. Born of our sister Mary and the Holy Spirit, guarded by our brother Joseph with fatherly care, Jesus came among us as a baby, humbly born, cradled beside the beasts and warmed by their breath, human as we are, in need of human love.

All: Yet kings bowed down before him, bringing gifts and emperors were troubled by his reign—this Child in whom all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell.

P: This Word of God made flesh and full of grace was sent to deliver us from our sin, from the power of evil and the fear of death. As a servant, Jesus emptied himself of might upon the cross, and as the risen Anointed One is enthroned at God's right hand to bring mercy and justice to all the earth at the end of days. And so, rejoicing in all God has done for us, we proclaim the mystery of our faith:

All: Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again!

P: Holy God, as you visited us in the birth of Jesus, visit us now by the power of your Spirit in these creatures of bread and wine, making them for us the Body and Blood of Christ, the banquet of heaven here on earth, as we remember how Jesus took bread and blessed and broke it and gave it to his friends, saying, "Take, eat, This is

my body, given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me." and after supper, took a cup of wine and blessed and gave it to them, saying: "Drink this, all of you. This cup is the new covenant in my blood, poured out for you and for many for the forgiveness of sin. Do this for the remembrance of me." Blessed God, shed your grace brighter than starlight on us that we may bear your good tidings to all and renew the weary world in your name: the name of Emmanuel—God-With-Us,

All: to whom we give honor and glory in joy, now and forever. Amen.

Then take a cup of grape juice (white) or wine (red) from the assistant, partake, then return to your seat via the side aisles, depositing your disposable cup in the provided bowls.

For communion at your seat with pre-packaged kit:


You may come to the altar rail as above, take a communion kit from the assistant, and return to your seat to partake. The ushers will come around to collect empty kits.


