All: Through baptism into the body of Christ, you transformed our lives and made us whole.


P: Send now your Spirit to move in our midst and soak us with your gifts of mercy, love, and grace.

The Story that Shapes and Forms Us

INTRODUCTION TO THE WORD

Reader: Holy One, our light and our salvation, open our ears

to hear your word.

All: Open our hearts to welcome your love. Amen.

Reader: The first reading is from First Corinthians, chapter

one, beginning with the eighteenth verse.

READING: 1 Corinthians 1:18-31

The message about the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God. For it is written,

"I will destroy the wisdom of the wise, and the discernment of the discerning I will thwart." Where is the one who is wise? Where is the scribe? Where is the debater of this age? Has not God made foolish the wisdom of the world? For since, in the wisdom of God, the world did not know God through wisdom, God decided, through the foolishness of our proclamation, to save those who believe. For Jews demand signs and Greeks desire wisdom, but we proclaim Christ crucified, a stumbling block to Jews and foolishness to Gentiles, but to those who are the called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God. For God's foolishness is wiser than human wisdom, and God's weakness is stronger than human strength.

Consider your own call, brothers and sisters: not many of you were wise by human standards, not many were powerful, not many were of noble birth. But God chose what is foolish in the world to shame the wise; God chose what is weak in the world to shame the strong; God chose what is low and despised in the world, things that are not, to reduce to nothing things that are, so that no one might boast in the presence of God. He is the source of your life in Christ Jesus, who became for us wisdom from God, and righteousness and sanctification and redemption, in order that, as it is written, "Let the one who boasts, boast in the Lord."

Reader: Here ends the reading.

All: news of salvation and hope, news of light and





L: God is with you.

THE EUCHARIST

P: It is right, and a good and joyful thing, always and everywhere to give thanks to you, God almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

All: You created us, unique, human creatures, created to love and be loved, created to seek relationship with you and each other.

P: We give thanks to you for your gift of our sexuality, that which calls us into intimate relationship with each other.

All: We give thanks to you for your gift of those we love and who love us, especially those in covenant relationship with us, who embody your presence to us in many and holy ways.

P: Holy are you, and blessed is your Son Jesus the Christ. Through him, you showed us a new way to be in relationship with you and with each other, to care for one another and the stranger, and to see you in different ways.

All: Through him, you showed us a new level of acceptance and new ways to worship you.

P: By the baptism of his suffering, death, and resurrection you gave birth to your church,

All: delivered us from slavery to sin and death, and made with us a new covenant by water and the Spirit.

P: Through this community which you have called together through our concern, our passion, and our seeking to know you, we learn more about you, your sustaining love, and your own passion for justice and liberation for all.

On the night in which he gave himself up for us, Jesus took bread, gave thanks to you, broke the bread, gave it to his disciples, and said: "Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me."

When the supper was over, he took the cup, gave thanks to you, gave it to his disciples, and said: "Drink from this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, poured out for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me."

And so, in remembrance of these your mighty acts in Jesus Christ, we offer ourselves in praise and thanksgiving as a holy and living sacrifice, in union with Christ's offering for us, as we proclaim the mystery of faith.

All: Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again.

P: Pour out your Holy Spirit on us gathered here, and on these gifts of bread and wine. Make them be for us the body and blood of Christ, that we may be for the world the body of Christ, redeemed by his blood.

All: Strengthen us for our witness and our service in your name. Increase in us our courage and wisdom as we live and work for your realm.


FRACTION RITE

For communion at the altar rail:



Then take a cup of grape juice (white) or wine (red) from the assistant, partake, then return to your seat via the side aisles, depositing your disposable cup in the provided bowls.

For communion at your seat with pre-packaged kit:


You may come to the altar rail as above, take a communion kit from the assistant, and return to your seat to partake. The ushers will come around to collect empty kits.




