WELCOME TO THE STORY

Wisdom prepares a feast, sets her table, and invites all to come and eat her bread and drink her wine. The first chapter of John's gospel owes much to the biblical tradition that imagined Wisdom as existing before anything was created and having a role in the work of creation. Christ, the wisdom of God (1 Cor. 1:24), today invites us to eat his flesh and drink his blood. John's gospel includes no account of the institution of the Lord's supper, but here we can't help hearing Jesus' words as an invitation to the meal of bread and wine we share.

INTRODUCTION TO THE WORD

- R: God, teach us how to dance to the rhythm of your wisdom;
- All: show us how to laugh
- R: so that we can live for the praise of your glory in Jesus Christ.

- R: The first reading is from the book of Proverbs, chapter nine, beginning with the first verse.

FIRST READING: Proverbs 9:1-6

Wisdom has built her house; she has set up her seven pillars.
She has prepared her food, decanted her wine, and set her table.
She has sent out her household staff to call from a spot overlooking the city.
"Whoever wants enlightenment, step this way!" she says, inviting all who lack common sense.
"Come, eat my bread and drink the wine which I have prepared for you.

- Abandon your foolishness that you may live, and walk the path of understanding!"
- R: Here ends the reading. The second reading is from Ephesians, chapter five, beginning with the fifteenth verse.

SECOND READING: *Ephesians* 5:15-20

Keep careful watch over your conduct. Don't act like fools, but like wise and thoughtful people. Make the most of your time, for these are evil days. Don't continue in ignorance, but try to discern the will of God. Avoid getting drunk on wine that is debauchery! Instead be filled with the Spirit, meditating on psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making music to God in your hearts. Always give thanks to Abba God for everything, in the name of Jesus our Messiah. R: Here ends the reading.



GOSPEL: John 6:51-58 Inclusive

[Jesus said,] "I myself am the living bread come down from heaven. If any eat this bread, they will live forever; the bread I will give for the life of the world is my flesh."

The Temple authorities then began to argue with one another. "How can he give us his flesh to eat?"

Jesus replied, "The truth of the matter is, if you don't eat the flesh and drink the blood of the Chosen One, you won't have life in you. Those who do eat my flesh and drink my blood have eternal life, and I will raise them up on the last day. For my flesh is real food and my blood is real drink. Everyone who eats my flesh and drinks my blood lives in me, and I live in them. Just as the living Abba God sent me and I have life because of Abba God, so those who feed on me will have life because of me. This is the bread that came down from heaven. It's not the kind of bread your ancestors ate, for they died; whoever eats this kind of bread will live forever."





- All: he gives the brooding Spirit to bring to birth a living hope.
- *P:* Therefore, with all that has life through him; with animals and angels and all who hope for a new creation, we share the song of love which sounds from all eternity:



- *P:* Holy are you, and holy is your child, Jesus Christ, who taught his disciples in stories and parables,
- All: that the realm of God is all around us when we look with the eyes of faith.

- P: On the night in which he gave himself up, Jesus took bread, gave thanks to you, broke the bread, and gave it to the disciples, saying: "Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me." When the supper was over, Jesus took the cup, offered thanks and gave it to the disciples, saying: "Drink from this, all of you; this is my life in the new covenant, poured out for you and for many, for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me." And so, in remembrance of your mighty acts in Jesus Christ, we proclaim the mystery of faith:
- All: Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.
- P: Pour out your Holy Spirit on us, and on these gifts of bread and wine. Make them be for us the body and blood of Christ, that we may be the body of Christ to a world that yearns to be made new.
- All: We ask this through Jesus Christ our Savior, by whom and with whom and in whom in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory be yours, Mother of blessings, for ever and ever. Amen.

THE LORD'S PRAYER

- *P:* Gathered into one by the Holy Spirit, let us pray as Jesus taught us, using the language or translation of our hearts.




FRACTION RITE

Holy Communion is open to all.


Wine is red, grape juice is yellow, water is in the center of the tray. Gluten-free wafers are available upon request.

For communion at the altar rail:

When directed by the ushers, you may come up the center aisle to the altar rail, stand or kneel, and hold out your hand for the pastor to drop the host into. Eat. Then take a cup of wine (red), grape juice (light yellow), or water (clear) from the assistant. Drink. Then place your empty cup in the tray that follows. Rise and return to your seat via the side aisles.


