#### The Story that Shapes and Forms Us

#### INTRODUCTION TO THE WORD

R: You are the living God who sustains all life in continually unfolding ways. And now may we open our ears to your continually unfolding Word. You speak to us in new and vital and imperative ways.

All: With all the power you have given us, let us be silent and open to listening... for nourishment, comfort, for challenge and new focus. Amen.

R: The first reading is from the book of Jeremiah, chapter thirty-one, beginning with the thirty-first verse.

#### FIRST READING: Jeremiah 31:31–34

"Behold, the days are coming, says Yahweh, when I will establish a new covenant with the house of Israel and the house of Judah. It will not be like the covenant I made with their ancestors when I took them by the hand to bring them up out of the land of Egypt—a covenant they broke, though I was their spouse, says Yahweh.

But this is the covenant I will

make with the house of Israel after those days, says Yahweh: I will put my Law in their minds and on their hearts. I will be their God, and they will be my people.

"No longer will they need to teach one another or remind one another to listen to Yahweh. All of them, high and low alike, will listen to me, says Yahweh, for I will forgive their misdeeds and will remember their sins no more.

R: Here ends the reading. The second reading is from Romans, chapter three, beginning with the nineteenth verse.

#### **SECOND READING:** Romans 3:19–28

Now we know that what the Law says is said to those under the Law. Therefore, let every mouth be silenced, and let all of humankind be open to God's judgment. This is because we are not justified in the sight of God by keeping the Law: law only makes us aware of sin.

But now the justice of God has been manifested apart from the Law, even though both Law and prophets bear witness to it; the justice of God works through faith in Jesus Christ for all who believe. There are no exceptions: everyone has sinned; everyone falls short of the glory of God. Yet everyone has also been undeservedly justified by the gift of God, through the redemption wrought in Christ Jesus. God presented Christ as a propitiatory sacrifice, for the atonement of all who have faith in Christ's blood. And God did so to manifest divine justice—because God showed forbearance by remitting sins committed in the past, in order to demonstrate divine justice in the present—so that the Most High might be both a just judge and the One who justifies those who believe in Jesus.

What room is there then for boasting? It is ruled out. In what law do we boast—the law of works? No: only the law of faith. We maintain that one is justified by faith—apart from keeping the Law.

R: Here ends the reading.

R: Our God is the source of wisdom and understanding.

All: Bless us with your gifts, O God.

R: Our God feeds us with the bread of life and the wellspring of our salvation.





#### THE SANCTUS



P: In the night in which he was betrayed, Jesus took bread, and gave thanks; broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying: "Take and eat; this is my body, given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me." Again, after supper, he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it up for all to drink, saying: "This cup is the new covenant in my blood, shed for you and all people for the forgiveness of sin. Do this for the remembrance for me." With thanksgiving we take this bread, and this cup and proclaim the mystery of faith.

All: Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

P: Pour out your Holy Spirit upon us that this meal may be a communion in the body and blood of our Lord.

All: Make us one with Christ and with all who share this feast.

P: Unite us in faith, encourage us with hope, inspire us to love.

All: that we may serve as your faithful disciples until we feast at your table in glory.

P: We praise you, eternal God, through Christ your Word made flesh, in the holy and life-giving Spirit, now and forever.

All: Amen.

#### THE LORD'S PRAYER

P: Gathered into one by the Holy Spirit, let us pray as Jesus taught us, using the language or translation of our hearts.

All: Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as in heaven. Give us today our daily bread. Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us. Save us from the time of trial and deliver us from evil. For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours, now and forever. Amen.

Wine is red, grape juice is yellow, water is in the center of the tray. Gluten-free wafers are available upon request.

Let an usher know if you need communion brought to you.

#### For communion at the altar rail:

When directed by the ushers, you may come up the center aisle to the altar rail, stand or kneel, and hold out your hand for the pastor to drop the host into. Eat. Then take a cup of wine (red), grape juice (light yellow), or water (clear) from the assistant. Drink. Then place your empty cup in the tray that follows. Rise and return to your seat via the side aisles.


