November begins with All Saints Day and ends in or near Advent, when we anticipate Christ's coming again. It is fitting, then, that the readings today tell of the final resurrection and the end time. In the turmoil of hope, fear, and disbelief that these predictions provoke in us, Hebrews sounds a note of confident trust. Christ makes a way for us where there is no way, and we walk it confidently, our hearts and bodies washed in baptismal water, trusting the one who has promised forgiveness. The more we see the last day approaching, the more important it is to meet together to provoke one another to love.

WE LISTEN AND THINK

INTRODUCTION TO THE WORD

R: Your Word is our salt; without it, we lose our being, our joy, and our ability to endure.

All: Open our hearts and our minds to listen, to really listen, to your Word today.

R: The first reading is from Hebrews, chapter ten, beginning with the eleventh verse.

FIRST READING: Hebrews 10:11-25

Every other priest performs services every day and offers the same sacrifices many times; but these sacrifices can never take away sins. Christ, however, offered one sacrifice for sins, an offering that is effective forever. Then Christ sat down at the right hand of God, and now waits there until God puts all enemies in their rightful place. With one sacrifice then, Jesus has made perfect forever those who are being sanctified.

The Holy Spirit also attests to this, first saying, "'This is the Covenant I will make with them when those days arrive,' says our God: 'I will put my laws into their hearts and write them on their minds.'"

Then she adds, "I will never again remember their sins or offenses."

So when sins and evil deeds have been forgiven, an offering to take away sins is no longer needed.

Therefore, sisters and brothers, since the blood of Jesus makes us confident to enter the holy place by the new and living path opened for us through the veil—that is to say, the body of Jesus—and since we have the supreme high priest presiding over the house of God, let us enter it filled with faith

and with sincerity in our hearts, our hearts sprinkled and cleared from any trace of bad conscience and our bodies washed with pure water. Let us keep firm in the hope we profess, because the One who made the promise is faithful.

Let us always think how we can stimulate each other to love and good works. Don't stay away from the meetings of the community, as some do, but encourage one another; and do this all the more as you see the Day drawing near.



GOSPEL: *Mark* 13:1-8

As [Jesus] came out of the temple, one of his disciples said to him, "Look, Teacher, what large stones and what large buildings!" Then Jesus asked him, "Do you see these great buildings? Not one stone will be left here upon another; all will be thrown down."

When he was sitting on the Mount of Olives opposite the temple, Peter, James, John, and Andrew asked him privately, "Tell us, when will this be, and what will be the sign that all these things are about to be accomplished?" Then Jesus began to say to them, "Beware that no one leads you astray. Many will come in my name and say, 'I am he!' and they will lead many astray. When you hear of wars and rumors of wars, do not be alarmed; this must take place, but the end is still to come. For nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom; there will be earthquakes in various places; there will be famines. This is but the beginning of the birth pangs."

P: The Gospel of our Risen Savior.



L: Hear us, O God


All: Your mercy is great.

WORDS OF INSTITUTION

- P: It is right, and a good and joyful thing, always and everywhere to give thanks to you, God Almighty, creator of heaven and earth.
- All: You created us, unique, human creatures, created to love and be loved, created to seek relationship with you and each other.
- P: Holy are you, and blessed is your Son Jesus the Christ. Through him, you showed us a new way to be in relationship with you and with each other, to care for one another and the stranger, and to see you in different ways.
- All: Through him, you showed us a new level of acceptance and new ways to worship you.
- P: By the baptism of his suffering, death, and resurrection you gave birth to your church, delivered us from slavery to sin and death, and made with us a new covenant by water and the Spirit. Through this community which you have called together through our concern, our passion, and our seeking to know you,
- All: we learn more about you, your sustaining love, and your own passion for justice and liberation for all.

P: On the night in which he gave himself up for us Jesus took bread, gave thanks to you, broke the bread, gave it to his disciples, and said: "Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me." When the supper was over, he took the cup, gave thanks to you, gave it to his disciples, and said: "Drink from this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, poured out for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me." And so, in remembrance of these your mighty acts in Jesus Christ, we offer ourselves in praise and thanksgiving as a holy and living sacrifice, in union with Christ's offering for us, as we proclaim the mystery of faith.

All: Christ has died; Christ is risen; Christ will come again.

P: Pour out your Holy Spirit on us gathered here, and on these gifts of bread and wine. Make them be for us the body and blood of Christ, that we may be for the world the body of Christ, redeemed by his blood.

All: Strengthen us for our witness and service in your name. By your Spirit make us one with Christ, one with each other, and one in ministry to all the world.

P: Through your Son Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit in your holy church, all honor and glory is yours, almighty Creator, now and forever.

P: The bread is ready, the cup is filled, the table is set.


All: Let all who are hungry for the love of God, come and be fed.

The ushers will invite you to God's Table after the Lamb of God is sung.




Holy Communion is open to all.

Wine is red, grape juice is yellow, water is in the center of the tray. Gluten-free wafers are available upon request.

Let an usher know if you need communion brought to you.

For communion at the altar rail:

When directed by the ushers, you may come up the center aisle to the altar rail, stand or kneel, and hold out your hand for the pastor to drop the host into. Eat. Then take a cup of wine (red), grape juice (light yellow), or water (clear) from the assistant. Drink. Then place your empty cup in the tray that follows. Rise and return to your seat via the side aisles.

POST COMMUNION BLESSING


P: O God, you are Hospitality. You are Welcome.




